



The EndeavourCat 44 A Statement of Excellence



The Salon



Step down the companionway into this salon and you'll be astonished by its spaciousness. No other narrow beam catamaran can boast such a spacious and comfortable salon for entertaining guests or just relaxing. The interior layout has been designed with the most efficient use of space of any vessel on the market, easily 30% more living space and 35% more storage space than any other vessel of equal length.

No more crowding around the salon table on this yacht. The EndeavourCat 44's salon has plenty of room for all your guests. And how many yachts have room to hang a painting of this size? This is one yacht that you can make your home...or second home. Comfortable, spacious and luxurious, yet it's very easy to maintain. The teak and holly flooring gives this thoroughly modern salon the look of a traditional luxury yacht.





The port side has another settee with an open backrest, allowing visual contact and conversation with those in the galley. The placement of hatches and the wide, fixed windows keeps the salon bright with natural light during the day. Visibility is excellent. And with a minimum interior height of 6 1/2 feet, the EndeavourCat 38 stands head and shoulders above other yachts its size.

The beautiful salon table can be expanded in every direction. It can be raised, lowered and opened into any number of convenient configurations, depending on your needs. This versatile, custom made table converts from a small coffee table, to a medium sized dining table and keeps unfolding into a truly huge dining table, large enough to sit for eight or nine with additional chairs.



The Galley

The EndeavourCat 44 is available with two galley options. You can have your galley on the upper level adjacent to the salon, or you can choose to have your galley in the port hull. It's a personal preference and the choice is yours. Either way you get a first class galley, capable of preparing gourmet meals for you and your guests.



The galley up arrangement keeps those on kitchen duty right in the middle of all the activities in the salon. For those used to having a wide open kitchen, this arrangement may be for you.

With the bi-level galley, all of the kitchen work is out of the salon area and it makes the salon that much larger. We call this a bi-level galley because it offers the best of both worlds. Your upper body is still open to the salon so that you're able to converse with guests in the salon while keeping your dirty dishes and kitchen prep out of sight.



The bi-level galley does afford more work area and storage than the galley up option. There are cupboards and drawers on both sides of the galley. And plenty of room for two, or even three people to work together without getting in each other's way.

The Staterooms



The Master Suite is located on the upper level, just forward of the salon. It has a queen size bed, a hanging closet, drawers and shelves for books, videos, and even a space already wired for an optional TV/VCR. The large fixed window floods the room with natural light. Two overhead hatches let the breezes flow in and screens keep the bugs out.

If you opt for the full width, beam-to-beam master stateroom, you'll have a laundry/dressing room to port, with even more storage, a vanity and room for the optional clothes washer/dryer and fold-away ironing board. To starboard is the owner's head, accessible only from the master stateroom.



There are identical guest staterooms fit for a queen located aft in each hull. Each stateroom has a dressing area and a hanging closet with drawers beneath. There is plenty of room for everything to have its place. Large opening ports with screens let the breezes flow through and the optional 12 volt fans keep the air moving even when the air outside is still. With the staterooms in opposite corners of the boat, you have the utmost privacy for yourself and for your guests.



The Heads



EndeavourCats are known for having bright, functional, well ventilated heads with large, separate shower stalls. The EndeavourCat 44 carries on this tradition in a big way. This spacious yacht has two fully equipped heads. The owner's private head, accessible only from the owner's stateroom has a full size shower stall all the amenities you'd expect to find in a luxury yacht.



The guest head is comparably equipped with Corian sinks, Gibraltar counter tops and high-polish, stainless steel fixtures, and of course, another shower stall.

The Cockpit



The cockpit of the EndeavourCat 44 is like a second salon. Its huge size makes it ideal for entertaining. Covered by a fixed hardtop and optional side curtains, this sun-room is protected from weather and insects. The expandable cockpit table will comfortably seat up to eight. Even expanded to full size, it's never in the way because there are port, starboard and aft exits from the cockpit.



Steering and sail handling take place at the bulkhead and will not interfere with your guests. The steering station is out of the weather and laid out for visibility and convenience. It's all business with ample space for every piece of electronics you could ever want. Even large radars and the popular big screen chart plotters. Optional side curtains with screens make the cockpit comfortable in all kinds of weather.

Sail Handling



The attention to detail that you see throughout the interior of Endeavour yachts is also evident up on deck. The latest materials and deck layout are evident. The mainsail is fully battened so there's no more flapping around in heavy weather. With the full length battens and the rigid boom vang, the mainsail holds its shape under all points of sail, even in the lightest air. To perform a tack, all you have to do is turn the steering wheel. Both main and jib are completely self-tacking. This is one sailing yacht that will not wear you out. When lowering sail, both sails fall neatly into lazy-jacks and a Boom Bag for the main is attached permanently to the foot of the sail so it's always right where you need it.



EndeavourCats are designed to be sailed single-handed, making them ideal for a husband and wife crew. All lines lead to the cockpit and are color coded for easy identification. Sheet stoppers make sheet control simple and easy. It's no accident that they're at the right height and angle for minimum friction and ease of operation. You can raise, lower and reef the sails without ever leaving the safety of the cockpit. Two speed winches are standard, and the optional electric winches make sail handling as easy as pushing a button.



The Engines

The EndeavourCat 44 is powered by twin 29 hp diesels. Each engine has its own 90 amp, dedicated engine cranking battery and 55 amp alternator. Engines, transmissions, fuel filters, engine room blowers, battery disconnect switch, engine battery parallel switch, seawater intakes and strainers are all located under the bunks in the aft staterooms. As you can see, there's plenty of room to reach everything during maintenance. Cruising speed is around 8 knots. The 120 gallon fuel tank gives you a cruising range of well over 600 miles.



Access to the engines for service is easy. Just lift the bunk and the engine and transmission are right there with plenty of room to work on all sides of the engine. Strainers for engine cooling and for the optional central air-conditioning system are located in the engine compartment and are easy to reach for cleaning.



Power from the twin diesel engines is transformed into forward motion by sail-drives with props that fold to reduce drag when under sail.
